Media Registration and Eligibility

There is no charge for media to attend the meeting.

Media badges are available to working press who can show evidence that their meeting attendance results in news or feature coverage in print, broadcast or recognized internet media. AAOMS reserves the right to inspect the credentials of anyone registering as press. To obtain a media badge, identification certifying you as a working member of the print or broadcast news media and/or a letter stating you are on assignment to cover the meeting is required. Membership cards from communications or writer organizations are not sufficient to establish eligibility.

Meeting Information

Credentialed media representatives are welcome and encouraged to attend most scientific sessions and lectures. The American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) should be credited in published news resulting from information presented at the 2024 AAOMS Annual Meeting.

Note: Opinions and information presented in sessions, interviews or conversations do not necessarily represent the opinions or endorsement of AAOMS.

Media Registration and Eligibility

AAOMS will provide media credentials at no cost to verified media representatives who register to attend the Annual Meeting. *Individuals who are registered as exhibitors may not register as media.*

Use of Media Credentials

Press covering any session at the Annual Meeting must observe the following rules established for all attendees, including:

- Television cameras/crews are not allowed in educational sessions. On-camera interviews must be scheduled with AAOMS Communications staff in advance and conducted in public areas.
- Audio recordings in educational sessions are prohibited unless approved in advance and then only utilized for personal use (i.e., for taking notes).
- Videotaping of educational sessions is strictly prohibited.
- If a session is full or close to full, media will stand at the back of the room.

AAOMS reserves the right to restrict media attendance at any portion of the meeting. Staff stationed at the entrance of each session will inform media if the session is closed to the press. Please see the back of the media information sheet for a list of sessions closed to the media.

Media Badge Revocation

Any individual who violates the criteria set forth for media attendees will immediately forfeit press credentials for this and subsequent meetings. Specifically, members of the media are considered to be in violation of AAOMS policy if they:

- Sell, market or represent a company for the purpose of obtaining advertising, subscriptions or other business from any registrant or exhibitor.
- Market a product or service represented in the Annual Meeting.
- Misrepresent themselves in order to obtain media credentials.
