Gov. Stitt,

The Oklahoma Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (OMSs) would like to thank you for your leadership during this difficult time for our state in response to COVID-19. We as OMSs are a vital part of the health care team and part of the response. One of our primary goals is to alleviate dental pain and infections, which can be life threatening if left untreated.

As the COVID-19 pandemic crisis continues to escalate, our profession will play a crucial role in treating these patients in private facilities and away from the emergency rooms. This is so vital because it decreases an already overtaxed medical system and minimizes patient exposure to the virus.

However, in order to accomplish these objectives, our surgeons must have access to the proper personal protective equipment, including N-95 masks. We are in close proximity to these patients and aerosols are generated, which puts us at high risk for exposure to COVID-19. In fact, CDC Interim Prevention and Control Recommendations for Patients with Suspected or Confirmed Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Healthcare Setting recommends prioritizing respirators and AIIRs for aerosol-generating procedures.

The OSOMS implores you to consider making OMSs critical first responders allowing for immediate access to these masks as they become available. With these important protective devices, we can simultaneously provide essential care to patients in need and stem the spread of the virus.
